

Speaking of CME, I am delighted to announce that the Royal College approved CASL's application for accreditor status. This is a major step for our association and it will certainly lend great support to our mandate for liver related CME programming throughout the country. We owe a huge thanks to Hemant Shah and his team for this accomplishment.

Finally I would like to acknowledge the landmark CLF \$1.2 million three-year research grant that was recently awarded to Dr. Ian McGilvray, and his multidisciplinary team of experts at the University Health Network (UHN) who are developing a new way to treat liver cancer using nanotechnology. Congratulations!! This was a competitive grant application that was adjudicated by our CASL research committee. The grant itself was made possible thanks to the generosity of a CLF donor (who wishes to remain anonymous) and matching funds from the Toronto General and Western Hospital Foundation (TG&WHF). This is the largest single research grant in the Canadian Liver Foundation's history and I think we should all be very proud of this significant achievement for liver research.
